- In several physician associates (PAs) have erroniously prescribed medications to patients. If this has happened at your trust, please provide the following information: Answer: The Trust response is 0. Please note, Physician Associates do not prescribe at the Trust. Answer: We do not record this detail directly. This would only me noted in the incident description if the reporter chose to include it, and a search for 'physician associate'/'PA' does not return any results.
