The below response shows the number of patients that have been diagnosed with the ICD10 codes requested from inpatient and outpatient settings from 01/04/2022 – 31/03/2023.

Please note:

This is a joint response for Northern and Eastern Services, however between 01/04/2022 – 07/07/2022 for Northern Services we cannot obtain outpatient diagnosis figures, as they are not held in an electronic format.

This data it would not be appropriate to release under FOI as it is personal data and would not be lawful or transparent to patients to view their records for this purpose. Inpatient figures are included for this time period.

- 1) Paediatric patients with septic arthritis in native joints M00.9: 10
- 2) Paediatric patients with prosthetic joint infection (PJI) T84.5 + Y83.1: Zero.
- 3) Adult patients with septic arthritis in native joints M00.9: 81.
- 4) Adult patients with prosthetic joint infection (PJI) T84.5 + Y83.1: 20.

When investigating septic arthritis in native joints in both paediatric and adult patients:

- 5) Is joint aspirate collected in ED/triage, Assessment unit, inpatient ward, or theatre?. Combination of all of above, depending on various patient/logistical factors.
- 6) Does the above differ for prosthetic joint infections? If yes, please clarify how this differs: Yes these get aspirated in theatres.
